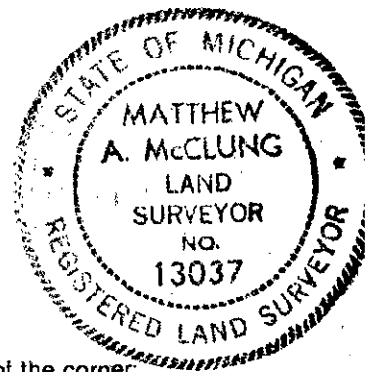
A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

The original corner was set by deputy surveyor Sylvester Sibley on July 7, 1838. Set wood post 39.94 chains from the East Beech tree 6" for corner

From 1891 to 1904 approximately, Osceola County had a remonumentation program, in which surveyors Temple and Trumbull, did the work. For the most part, a 3" glazed tile filled with cinders from a forge, were placed at each government set corner in the township. There were supposed to be 3 tile per corner, placed atop of each other, (continued on back)

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

Found 5/8" Iron & cap # 13037 as described on LCRC Broke asphalt away and set Osceola County Monument over to 2" depth. This corner is in a 6.0 ft. fill.



C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

Corner D-7 Osceola County Monument, which is a 3" brass cap mounted on a 1" pipe 18" in length.
 Face of riser box S35E 40.80 feet
 1" White Pine S65W 91.18 feet
 Easterly of two Utility poles N45°W 64.34'
 3" Apple N60E 94.29 feet

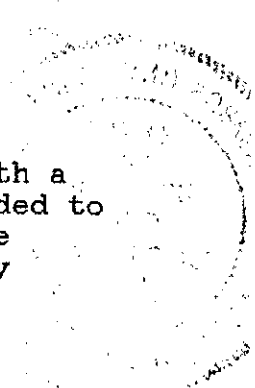
