A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration: The original corner was set by deputy surveyor John Hodgson on Sept. 24, 1837. Set wood post 80.00 chains from the Southeast Corner of Section 31. Cedar 18" S50E 60 lks. Cedar 8" N64W 28 lks. From 1891 to 1904 approximately, Osceola County had a remonumentation program, in which surveyors Temple and Trumbull, did the work. For the most part, a 3" glazed tile filled with cinders from a forge, were placed at each government set corner in the township. There were supposed to be 3 tile per corner, placed atop of each other, (continued on back)

thereby making the corner 4 feet long. Sometimes a solid tile, with a cross in the top was used, and sometimes a 1/2" iron bars were added to the tile. Notes of the work were kept in ledgers, and given to the townships, and 5 of the townships have been recorded in the County records.

This corner was found and recorded in the Marion Twp. book, as the Southwest Corner of section 31, as tile and rod, dated 1908. (date is not clear as to last digit. Witness Fence post NE 39.7 feet.

Same as above, recorded in Highland Twp. book, about 1930.

This corner was used by myself in a survey for Raymond Rocker, date 12 Nov. 1987. I was not paid for this survey, therefore i did not record the survey or file a PA 74 form. I added the sucker rod and witnessed as: Fence post NE 39.7 ft. and Power Pole S75W 151.90 ft.
