E-6 Found "PK" nail, 3" below surface of asphalt road, and accepted as a careful and faithful perpetuation of the position of the original corner.

Found nail in West side of 28" Maple N26°30'E 66.75' (E)  
Found "PK" nail in NE side of Telephone Pole N65°30'W 37.19' (E)



C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

E-6 Removed "PK" nail, and replaced with 3/4" X 24" Steel Bar with Ottawa County Remon Cap, 2" below surface of asphalt road in Monument Box.  
Set Ottawa County Remon Tag & nail in West side of 28" Maple N26°30'E 66.81' (E)  
Set Ottawa County Remon Tag & nail in North side of Power Pole N89°30'E 40.32' (E)  
Set Ottawa County Remon Tag & nail in East side of Power Pole S16°30'W 113.36' (E)  
SE corner, house foundation S69°30'W 130.04' (E)  
Set Ottawa County Remon Tag & nail in NE side of Telephone Pole N65°30'W 37.07' (E)  
On centerline asphalt road North & South.  
Centerline fence remnants to East, 0.5' South.  
Centerline fence remnants to West (extended East), 5'± North.
