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

B. Description of comer evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing comer:

I found no remains of the original corner or accessories. A North-South gravel road now runs over the area of the Corner, and an old fenceline runs West from area of the Corner.

I created a position for the Corner at a proportionate distance between Section Corners to the North and South and held the centerline of the gravel road for the East-West position. This position works well with the fenceline to the West. I accepted this position as the 1/4 Corner and have monumented it as such.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:
