

A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

Original corner established by E.B. Searls, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, June 5, 1851. ORIGINAL, BEARING TREES: 24" Hemlock S27°E, 4 links, 12" Red Maple N21°W, 2 links. Corner restored by Donald D. Lappala (12585) on June 20, 1972 from Highway drawing and original field note calls. He set a 2"X5' long concrete filled galvanized iron pipe capped with a 3" stamped brass cap and the following new B.T.s: 9" Elm, N70°W, 47.4', 7" sugar maple S38°W, 99.7', 12" Elm, S65°W, 63.3' Center-line U.S.-45 West 75.8'. Corner recorded in Book 1 Land Corner, no page given.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

* established by Donald Lappala in 1972,

I found the 2"X5' long pipe completely destroyed by a cable laying machine. I restored the corner by using 2 of the bearing trees* namely the 9" Elm, N70°W, 47.4', which is now just a 7' high stub and the 7" Sugar Maple S38°W, 99.7'. This tree is alive and in good shape. The 12" Elm has been destroyed by additional clearing for a transmission line.
