

B. Description of comer evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

No original evidence was found. At the corner position I found " iron pin which was set by E.W. Applekamp No. 17610 in 1985 for a section subdivision. This pin is near the center of a gravel road and in line with a fence and woods/field line running North & South. The corner was set at this position as it is the only logical position for the corner.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

At the corner position I set a 5/8"X24" rebar with a  $3\frac{1}{4}"$  stamped cap 5" below the top of a gravel road.
