The  $SW_4^1$  of  $SW_4^1$ , Section 20, has been farmed since the 1930'S. The fence posts are still standing and the fields are being mowed. In 1946 a major logging road to service White River Lumber Co. in Bergland was built and crossed through the Southwest Corner of Section 20. This would have destroyed the Y. Birch bearing tree.
