Original corner and accessories have been destroyed by farming and road construction. The corner now falls in a North -South gravel road on the extension of fences to the East and West. At the intersection of centerline and fences, I dug down 18" and found a 3/4" iron pin and remains of a wooden post. This iron pin falls N 27° W 8.9 feet from the theoretical single prorated position. It is, however, the best remaining evidence of the original 1/4 corner, and it is consistent with over 60 years of occupation and land use.
