A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration: (J-11) ½ Corner Common to Section 26 & 35, T51N, R37W

1980 - Keith Sackett, R.L.S. 19006 for Michigan Department of Natural Resources, found a 1 1/2" I.D. iron pipe 15" above ground at the 1/16 Corner to the West, as well as the Northwest Corner of Section 35 but does not mention the North 1/2 Corner.

B. Description of comer evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found no remains of the original corner or accessories. I found Sackett's Northwest Corner and 1/16 Corner to the West. The area of the Corner has been disturbed by excavation for a culvert. I created a position for the North ¼ Corner by projecting a line from the Northwest Corner across the 1/16 Corner and doubling the distance. This position falls close to the intersection of the centerline of North-South Airport Road and an old fenceline to the West. I accepted this computed ¼ Corner position and monumented it. Distances to Section Corners East and West vary considerably from record GLO. I believe this to be a result of either gross error or fraudulent work by the original GLO Surveyor.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the comer:

Corner is a 5/8" x 24" iron pin with a 3" diameter aluminum cap stamped to read: COUNTY REMONUMENTATION; S.26, S.35; T.51N, R.37W; ¼; 1998; P.S. 37273. I also established a reference monument (R.M.) to the West, a 2 ½" x 30" aluminum pipe with a 3" diameter aluminum cap stamped to indicate that the ½ Corner is East a distance of 33.16 feet. The corner falls in approximate centerline of North-South gravel road and 2 feet North of extension of an old fenceline to the West.
