

1950-1960 - Michigan State Highway Department, (M.S.H.D.) found a 1" drill steel at this corner. They tied the corner into highway centerline control and gave bearings and distances from it to Section Corners to the East and West.

B. Description of comer evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found no remains of the original comer or accessories. The corner has been destroyed by the County road and highway construction. I did not recover the drill steel called for by M.S.H.D. I recreated the position of it from prorated M.S.H.D. bearings and distances from Section Corners to the East and West. This position works well with highway centerline control. It also works well with old county road running to the East and abandoned old road bed to North. The distance to the Section Corner to the East is quite long. I believe this is the result of either gross error or fraudulent work on the part of the original surveyors. I have accepted the M.S.H.D. position and have monumented it as such.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner;

Corner is a 2 1/2" x 30" aluminum pipe with a 3" diameter aluminum cap stamped to read: COUNTY REMONUMENTATION; S.25, S.36; 1/4; T.51N, R.38W; 1998; P.S. 37273. The Corner falls on the Southerly edge of Southerly gravel shoulder of Highway M-26, 24.5 feet South of centerline.
