

5. Private Claims

1980 - Keith L. Sackett, P.S. 19006, for Michigan DNR, recorded this corner in the Ontonagon County Register of Deeds Office, in Liber 1, Page 201 of Corner Records. He found a drill bit set by M.C. Larsen from Cedar B.T. not in original notes. He established 3 scribed N.B.T.s:

B. Description of comer evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found a very old 1 1/2" star drill bit as called for by Sackett. I also recovered all 3 of his N.B.T.s. It appears that this drill bit has been used as the 1/4 Corner for many years.

I accepted the drill bit as the ¼ Corner. It falls in the roots of a 20° Oak. I replaced the drill bit with a ¾" aluminum rod and slamped cap.
