

1985 - Earl W. Applekamp P.S. 17610 recorded a Survey in Liber 1 Page 79 of Surveys, which shows a 5/8" iron pin at the East 1/16th corner between Sections 5 and 8. The 1/2 corner is not shown.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found no remains of the original corner or accessories. I re-established the 1/2 corner by single proportionate measurement between Section corners to the East and West. This position works well with the 5/8" capped Earl Applekamp Iron recovered at the 1/16th corner one quarter mile to the east. Distances to Section Corners East and West work very well with GLO.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:
