

B. Description of comer evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found no remains of the original corner or accessories. I also found no remains of Lindgren's 1" iron pipe or Earl Applekamp's 5/8" iron pin. Woodspur road has been reconstructed since 1985. I recovered one of Lindgren's bearing trees. I used this bearing tree and Lindgren's distance from the NE corner of section 5 to recreate his corner position. This position works reasonably well with the remaining Right-of-Way irons from Earl Applekamp's survey. It also works well with other corners to the West. I accepted and Monumented this position as the Section Corner.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

Corner is a 5/8" iron pin with a 3" diameter aluminum cap stamped to read: COUNTY REMONUMENTATION: T.51N, R39W., S. 4, S.5, S.8, S.9; 1999; P.S. 37273. Corner falls 3' West of present centerline of Woodspur Road. also established a Reference Monument (R.M.) to the East, a 2 1/2" x 30" aluminum pipe with a 3" diameter aluminum BI BIEN cap stamped to indicate that the section corner is N89°02'W, 36.30'.
