

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

No original evidence could be found. At the corner position I found an old Hemlock post and a squared Cedar post. Both were rotted off and laying on the ground. There were 3 blazed trees pointing to this position. In the Copper Range Company records I found a coordinate for the corner. I ran a traverse to the Copper Range Coordinate position. This is where the old posts were. I re-established the corner at the Copper Range Coordinate. This position is in conformance with the original field note call to the Big Iron River.
