

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found the pipe called for by Hawley 86 feet West of a gravel road. I found the rotted remains of the original 12" Hemlock bearing tree with axe marks on the measuring notch still visible. I also recovered Bob Mick's bearing trees. "His 6" Cedar to the Northwest Is actually a 6" Balsam, now dead. Distances to the Sections Comers East and West work well. I accepted the Iron pipe as the 1/4 Corner. 2616.38
